Crime Updates (1st to 31st July)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Bicycle Theft	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	3	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	6	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.



Message from your Engagement Officer PC Pete Davison

I hope you are all enjoying the summer and have heard about our latest social media campaign encouraging residents to get in the habit of completing a **#9PMRoutine**.

The idea comes after the incredible success of a concept launched in Pasco County, Florida in America, which asks the public to check certain things around their home at a designated time.

Inspector Ed Brown, who suggested adopting the idea, said: "It's simple really - set a reminder on your phone for 9pm and when it goes off do some checks around the house. We know that some criminals are opportunistic, looking for that quick and easy win. By completing the #9PMRoutine residents are making life so much harder for offenders. This will ultimately result in a reduction in crime." Residents are asked to conduct the following checks: **1. Check your vehicles; 2. Shut your windows; 3. Lock your doors; 4. Check your outbuildings.**

The social media campaign aims to raise awareness and promote safer habits among residents to prevent unnecessary thefts from vehicles, as well as homes.
